
Dear Neighborn

On December 11, 1909, St. Louis was facing its sixth straight day of below freezing weather with a threat of snow that night. On the same day, Joseph Van Raalte, a jeweler and

prominent member of the Jewish community in St. Louis, was issued a building permit for a one story Odeon at 2635 Cherokee Street.

The previous month, Van Raalte purchased the vacant property where the future 2635 Cherokee and adjacent building would stand. Existing on the property was a large tent movie theater. The craze of picture shows first began in 1896 in New York City and reached St. Louis ten years later when Fred Wehrenberg began showing silent films in his grocery store at the northeast corner of Cherokee and Jef-

ferson. Van Raalte likely sought to expand his profits by constructing a permanent structure where films could be comfortably viewed year-round.

Van Raalte called his new venture The Vandora
Amusement Company.

He hired local architect
Otto J. Boehmer to design his new building. The Vandora Theater was in operation less than a dec-



ade. The advent of the feature length film brought the demise of the Odeon craze.

If you find yourself at 2635-37 Cherokee, step into the Fortune Teller Bar and buy a beer and raise a glass to its storied history.

Sexual Assault: The Facts

After threatening to shoot her if she didn't comply with his demands, he sexually assaulted her. Thanks to DNA evidence and the victim's identification of the man in a line up, Keith Smith was charged and convicted of Forcible Rape and Forcible Sodomy.

Every two minutes, someone in the United States faces the horror of being sexually assaulted. In any given week in Missouri, an average of 469 victims of sexual violence will receive services. Many more go unreported. In 2012, there were 199 rapes and attempted rapes in St. Louis.

It's easy to imagine the perpetrator of a sexual assault as a stranger lurking in a dark alley. However, nearly 2/3 of all rapes are committed by someone the victim knows.[ii] In fact, over 50% of sexual assault incidents reported by victims occurred within one mile of their home.[iii]

While some online lists purport that there are certain hairstyles or clothing that you should have to avoid being the victim of sexual assault, the truth is that there is no "typical profile" of a sexual assault victim. Sexual assault is a crime of opportunity and motive.

While no one can predict when and why an offender would strike, there are actions you can take to avoid potentially dangerous situations:

- Always trust your instincts. If a situation is making you uneasy, leave.


- Know your surroundings. Know where you are, who is around you, and where you could go for help.
- Never allow yourself to be isolated with someone you don't know or trust.
- Avoid wearing headphones or talking on the phone while walking alone. This can distract you and make you less aware of your surroundings.

There are many local resources available to victims of sexual assault. "Anyone who is sexually assaulted should call 911 right away," explained Lt. Harper, Commander of the St. Louis Metropolitan Police Department's Sex Crimes Unit. "The sooner you contact us, the sooner we can connect you to a sexual assault advocate who will stay with you throughout the process and get you immediate access to resources and services."

The St. Louis SART (Sexual Assault Response Team) provides specially trained advocates to assist victims 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. They also have a 24-hour Crisis Hotline at 314-531-7273.

When a sexual assault case reaches our office, we have a team of specially trained prosecutors who handle sex crimes cases. Victims will also receive support and guidance from our Victim Support Unit throughout the
