Governor Calls General Assembly Into Special Session


Gov. Jay Nixon on Aug. 29 issued a proclamation calling the General Assembly into a special legislative session to consider an omnibus economic development and tax credit reform bill and a handful of other proposals. The session will begin on Sept. 6 and is expected to last for less than two weeks.

The most controversial part of the economic development package involves \$360 million in tax incentives to develop an "Aerotropolis" – an international air cargo hub - at Lambert-St. Louis International airport. The Regional Commerce and Growth Association has produced an economic impact statement projecting that a St. Louis Aerotropolis could generate almost

\$34 billion of "combined output" over a twenty year period. However, some regional and national organizations ask why a venture calculated to be such a moneymaker would need taxpayer dollars to spur investment. Some note that congestion at Chicago's O'Hare International Airport will send freight forwarders looking for airports able to move goods more quickly and at a lower cost. Others claim that Lambert Airport is a long shot for selection due to key assets that are missing.

Other economic development proposals in the governor's call include:

Innvation Reinvestment Act to promote the location of technology-based businesses in the state



- restructuring and upgrading the state's job training and recruitment programs
- providing up to \$10 million a year in tax breaks for amateur sporting events

To pay for all of these new tax breaks, lawmakers propose to eliminate or cap the cost of various existing tax credit programs. Of particular concern is the possible elimination of renters from eligibility for the Circuit Breaker program. The Circuit Breaker reduces property taxes for the poorest segment of elderly citizens and persons living with disabilities. In 2010, the Circuit Breaker program helped almost 100,000 renters who were seniors, disabled veterans, or others living with disabilities.

Gov. Nixon specifically precluded lawmakers from considering changes to an existing land-assemblage tax credit for St. Louis developer Paul McKee. McKee has already collected \$28 million Jeanette Mott Oxford, 59th District

from the state for a proposed redevelopment of north St. Louis that has yet to occur. McKee had been seeking changes to the law to extend the timeframe under which he can qualify for additional credits. The Missouri Constitution prohibits lawmakers from passing legislation not requested by the governor during a special session.

In addition to the job creation and tax credit reform bill, the governor also authorized lawmakers to consider legislation:

- 1) authorizing the Department of Revenue to establish a temporary tax amnesty program to encourage people to pay back taxes owed to the state without penalty;
- 2) ending 150 years of state control of the St. Louis Metropolitan Police Department; and
- 3) moving Missouri's 2012 presidential primary, currently scheduled for Feb.7, to March 6 in order to comply with new rules being imposed by the national Democratic and Republican parties.

In the immediate term, the credit union ATM will remain in operation, and the vacant buildings on the site will be demolished as City permits are granted. A construction timeline has not yet been established."

Seuss Geisel (Dr. Seuss) and Gabriel García Márquez, each a terrific author in his ownright: "No llores porque ya se terminó... sonríe, porque sucedió." "Don't cry because it's over. Smile because it happened." I began this aldermanic voyage to make a difference in the 10th ward -- An area that was roughly from Cherokee to 4500 S. Broadway and the Mississippi River to Grand. It was, some said, troubled. But it was chock full of much potential. It was the Gravois Park, Marine Villa, part of Dutchtown and a dash of the Mt. Pleasant neighborhoods.

I became accustomed to that area. Seven years later the 10th ward, through a highly contentious struggle that saw a northside 20th ward come to the southside and a southeast ward (10th ward) move southwest, morphed into what I call the fertile crescent (including The Hill, Southwest Garden, and part of Kings Oak & Tower Grove South). The pain was exaggerated by the lengthy time we expended fighting over the redistricting map, spending a hideous summer, autumn and bleak winter of 2001 with various maps that all chose to move the 20th ward south into another even numContinued from Page 1 bered ward (10), surrounded by odd numbered wards (9, 11, 13, 15 & 25) so that elections could be maintained in their staggered sequence and integrated neighborhoods could be carved in such a way as to put a fig leaf on the Voting Rights Act.

I came out of that process essentially responsible for two wards -- 10 & 20. I came to cherish the people whom I legally represented in the new 10th ward, yet remained committed to my political roots, fighting for the turf that had long been home and the newly added neighborhood of Benton Park West.

I can honestly say that I was upset, frustrated, angry and disillusioned by the pettiness and divisiveness of the whole re-

Movie and a Bite The Help and BPW's Finest Restaurants

Movie . . . The Help.

September was approaching quickly. I had to write my review. As I perused the movies listings, nothing seemed too appealing. The Help, however appeared to be the best choice of my limited options.

Well . . . I really enjoyed this film. The Help is a story about Skeeter, an idealist young woman who wants to become a writer. Motivated by a sense of injustice, she takes on the task of convincing southern domestic workers, employed in during the tumultuous 1960s, to chronicle their stories.

Even though the story presented as if Skeeter's exposé piece

about the south was a selfless deed, it cannot be overlooked that Skeeter needed a sensational article in order to have her piece published in a major news outlet. Nevertheless through their accounts, the viewer is provided with some insight into the drudgery and humiliation domestic workers endured daily. Moreover it revealed their oftentimes overlooked feelings. Imagine the indignity of being forced to use an outside toilet. The movie illustrated a very harsh irony. Workers who were entrusted to care for that which is most important, a family's children, were yet afforded less respect than that given to a mite.

The cast did a wonderful job of

capturing the delicate relationship between the domestic worker and the family of their employ, which always seemed to verge between submission and an underlying simmering, potentially explosive, anger. The main cast included Emma Stone as Skeeter, Viola Davis as Aibileen and Octavia Spencer as Minny. Stone did a wonderful job in her portrayal of a young progressive writer; Davis depicted the sympathetic long suffering domestic caretaker and Spencer played her feisty best friend. Set in Jackson, Mississippi, the film, as anticipated sent me through an emotional rollercoaster. At times the waterworks flowed but there were

definitely some lighter more humorous scenes, which were momentary diversions from the harshness of the period.

A little aside: If you read my reviews you know I love an English accent. However I really love a southern accent. The politics of the movie aside, the southern accents in this movie were fabulous.

The Verdict: The Help is absolutely worth buying a full price ticket and taking a date but have your hankies ready. It is definitely a tear jerker.

2012 BPW Board Elections October 20, 7p - 2832 Arsenal, Five Star Senior Center

Duties of the six elected Board members, as outlined in the by-laws, are as follows:

President - preside at all meetings of the Corporation (Neighborhood Association) and of the Board of Directors at which he/ she may be present; will perform such other duties as may be prescribed in these bylaws or assigned to him/her by the Corporation or by the Board of Directors. He/she will coordinate the work of the officers and committees of the Corporation in order that the purposes may be promoted. As well, he/she

will keep and maintain all legal documents.

Vice-President - act as an aid to the President and perform the duties of the President in the absence or disability of that officer to act. He/she will also perform other duties assigned by the board; as well as submit a monthly report to the board of directors when necessary.

Secretary - record the minutes of all meetings of the Corporation and Board of Directors meetings. Also, this person will maintain all correspondence of the corporation.

Treasurer – custody of all the funds of the Corporation; will keep a full and accurate account of receipts and expenditures; and will make disbursements as authorized by the Corporation's Board of Directors. The Treasurer will be responsible for the maintenance of the financial records of the Corporation as conforming to the bylaws of the Corporation. He/she will also submit a monthly accounting of the finances to the board of directors.

Member-at-Large – providing an additional voice for the members of the Corporation

Additional Duties are outlined in the bylaws.

The committees are selected by nomination and also serve for one year terms. More detailed descriptions can be found on the BPWNA website

(<u>www.bentonparkwest.org</u>) or by contacting any board meember. The committees are:

Beautification Committee - works to improve the appearance of the neighborhood.

Block Link - a connection point between the residents and the neighborhood association.

Communications – Includes: The newsletter–*The Porch Review* giving information in and around Benton Park West; **The web-site**—providing information about BPW on the web; **Public Relations/Marketing**—sharing with BPW and the world about the things that make BPW a wonderful place to live.

Community Garden – a variety of gardens are scattered throughout the neighborhood bringing beauty and product to residents. You are welcome to volunteer or relax in the garden!

Dog Park – providing a fenced, off-leash recreation space in which owners and dogs can safely interact and socialize.

Facilities – providing support by setting up meeting space, maintaining the neighborhood office and physical assets owned by BPWNA.

Finance/Fundraising – coordinates the budget, planning for income to support the work of Benton Park West Neighborhood Association.

Membership – maintains and grows the association membership, organizes various events and supports fundraising.

Safety and Quality of Life - concerned with trash/trashcans, drug sales, guns, burned out streetlights, overgrown grass, quality housing for residents, new developments, and making BPW safe and comfortable. The new COP (Citizen's on Patrol) team is organized under this committee.

Youth Outreach - develops projects that specifically target the neighborhood youth and coordinates ways to include youth in regular neighborhood activities.

districting debacle of 2001. Yet, I am, in my opinion, a stronger advocate for the 20th ward, because of my experience in the new 10th ward. I was embraced by those who never voted for me. I worked just as hard for them as if I had chosen to be their elected representative. I spent every day driving the new 20th, going to meetings in the new 20th, returning constituent calls in the new 20th (if they figured out that I was available and willing to serve, even though they would be told that I was not their alderman), getting city services for the 20th ward, and simultaneously driving to the new 10th ward, returning consitutent calls, attending meetings and getting city services for them too. What

I most regret is that during 2001 to 2003 I was not allowed to directly continue our housing development expenditure efforts in the new 20th ward, because I was not recognized as the "official" alderman. This harmed our area. Parting from these new constituents -- who were chosen for me -- in 2003 when I was rethan I could ever have imagined. Many positive bonds were formed in a short time of less than 2 vears.

I was familiar with Benton Park West, even though it had not been part of the old 10th ward, because I had attended the meetings of the former Benton Park West neighborhood association that preceded this one. Just like I had attended Marine Villa meetings years before I ever ended up moving there. And, one of the persons who encouraged me to enter politics -- even though I never really had a notion of doing so,

because I wanted to serve people in the community, not run for office -- was Alderman Martie Aboussie (9th ward), who lived in Benton Park West.

I have come to know Benton Park West even better over the last 8 official years that I have worked with Alderman Ortmann to serve you. I can tell you that I believe the gerrymandered map was an exemplar of unaccountable government. How in the world could anyone know where the 9th ward ended and the 20th ward began. We were inextricably linked. And, had it not been for the working relationship that Alderman Ortmann and I have maintained, your good humor and excellent neighborhood leadership over the years, and a sense of teamwork that I wish permeated our entire city and region, we would have been in a heap of trouble. You are now a part of me forever.

"I wanted a perfect ending. Now I've learned, the hard way, that some poems don't rhyme, and some stories don't have a clear beginning, middle, and end. Life is about not knowing, having to change, taking the moment and making the best of it without knowing what's going to happen next." Gilda Radner (comedian and actress)

Like a fine stone or slab of marble, the old prickly, pointed wards have now been smoothed and reshaped into a work of art. It is as it should be, Benton Park west is consolidated with one alderman, Ken Ortmann, and Gravois Park is consolidated within the 20th ward. We have celebrated many wonderful things in Benton Park West during my term as alderman -- too numerous to recount. We have struggled together to defeat threats as well. Benton Park West has celebrations, fundraisers, events and meetings, all designed to maintain and improve the neighborhood. Neighborhood organizations now face a new threat -- the virtual world. Technology can be employed to communicate instantaneously with large numbers of neighbors, which is a good thing. But, the virtual world of social networking also seems to threaten to

keep attendance lower at neighborhood meetings. Part of a real community is getting together to get to know one another as people and neighbors.

My intent is to continue to attend Benton Park West meetings -- at least for awhile. But, it will be different, because now I have an emeritus role. As I leave I note that there is still capital improvement work that is occurring that we set in motion a while ago: alley paving for 32xx Ohio/Iowa and intersecting alley; numerous concrete sidewalks throughout the neighborhood.

Benton Park West has so much power collectively to improve the lots of others, to stand up for ideals of community service and improvement, to send forth those ripples of hope that will come crashing down in a current through the City. Benton Park West and other neighborhood groups are summoning a new spirit of service and responsibility that is almost countercultural, working to look after not only themselves but for each other. There is much work left to be done. I thank all of you for allowing me to be able to help you to be those ripples of hope. I know that you will continue to make a difference.

the fourth plane crashed in a field in Pennsylvania. Often referred to as 9/11, the attacks resulted in extensive death and destruction, triggering major U.S. initiatives to combat terrorism and defining the presidency of George W. Bush. Over 3,000 people were killed during the attacks in New York City and Washington, D.C. Those killed included 343 firefighters and 60 police officers from New York City and the Port Authority, and 8 private emergency medical technicians and paramedics. Another 184 people were killed in the attack on the Pentagon. The overwhelming majority of casualties were civilians, including nationals of over 70 countries.

This tenth anniversary of the tragedy which devastated not only New York City, but also all of the United States is this month. Let's make a point to remember the fallen employees who worked in the World Trade Center complex, all of those relief workers, police and fireman who lost their lives in the worst attack on American soil. The last major strike on American soil was Pearl Harbor in 1941.

Many activities occur every year such as families of those who were killed meet at the site to read the names of their loved ones. Many boroughs in New York City have blood drives to honor those who per-



Titizens on Patrol (COP) teams are composed of neighborhood residents interested in decreasing crime within their neighborhood. Nobody knows YOUR neighborhood better than you.

You are the key element in attempting to curb crime and resolve neighborhood problems.

This program incorporates many tasks that a regular police officer does during a regular shift. The emphasis of COP is to be ears and eyes of our community, while conducting nonconfrontational tasks.

Quality of Life is an extremely important aspect of our daily lives. COP strives to enhance the quality of life in a community by helping to fine-tune tools that residents already have. Benton Park West has gone through a revitalization in the last 6-8 years. Our streets might seem quiet, but that doesn't mean there is nothing else you can look for. Nuisance type problems such as over grown weeds and grass, non functioning street or alley lights, broken water lines during hot or extreme cold weather, graffiti and dilapidated houses effect the quality of life in your neighborhood and should be reported to the Citizens Service Bureau at 314-622-4800.

Many of your neighbors have already attended the one-time training. Those who have been trained will be a team as part of

the Quality of Life and Safety Committee for BPW (or respective neighborhood).

There is a process to ensure that everyone involved is safe, yet able to provide as much good information to our police to help in keeping our communities safe.

The thing to always remember, whether you are part of the COP program are the General Emergency Telephone Numbers:

Ambulance: 911

Fire: 911 Police: 911

Police non-emergency: 314-231-1212

The training is thorough, but not lengthy. There are basic rules which the COP team follows, the rules are important for protection of the team member as well as the entire community.

13 Things your burglar won't tell you!

Editors Note: This is the first installment of a series to help you be aware of items that burglars or car thieves look to give them an idea of how easy it would be to take what is not theirs!

This first installment includes thoughts that the burglar or car thief might have based upon your perception of the situation:

- 1. Of course I look familiar. I was here just last week cleaning your carpets, painting your shutters, or delivering your new refrigerator.
- **2.** Hey, thanks for letting me use the bathroom when I was working in your yard last week. While I was in there, I unlatched the back window to make my return a little easier.
- **3.** Love those flowers. That tells me you have taste... and taste means there are nice things inside. Those yard toys your kids leave out always make me wonder what type of gaming system they have.
- **4.** Yes, I really do look for newspapers piled up on the driveway. And I might leave a pizza flyer in your front door to see how long it takes you to remove it..
- **5.** If it snows while you're out of town, get a neighbor to create car and foot tracks into the house. Virgin drifts in the driveway are a dead giveaway.
- **6.** If decorative glass is part of your front en-

trance, don't let your alarm company install the control pad where I can see if it's set. That makes it too easy.

- 7. A good security company alarms the window over the sink. And the windows on the second floor, which often access the master bedroom - and your jewelry. It's not a bad idea to put motion detectors up there too.
- **8.** It's raining, you're fumbling with your umbrella, and you forget to lock your door understandable. But understand this: I don't take a day off because of bad weather.
- **9.** I always knock first. If you answer, I'll ask for directions somewhere or offer to clean your gutters. (Don't take me up on it.)
- **10.** Do you really think I won't look in your sock drawer? I always check dresser drawers, the bedside table, and the medicine cabinet.
- 11. Here's a helpful hint: I almost never go into kids' rooms.





Chocolate Lava Cake

Great chocolate treat with the filling just oozing with sweetness.

Prep time: 15 min **Makes:** 5-6 servings **Cook Time:** 0 min **Start to Finish:** 15 min

Ingredients:

- ½ lb butter
- 8 oz semi-sweet chocolate
- 4 oz sugar
- 5 oz CAKE flour (if using regular flour add ½ tsp baking powder)
- 4 egg yolks
- 4 whole eggs

Prep:

- 1. Melt butter and chocolate in non-stick pan (being careful to not have the flame too high and not burn).
- 2. Let cool to room temperature.
- 3. Beat the egg yolks and whole eggs.
- 4. Sift flour and sugar into the beaten eggs. MIX WELL making sure there are no flour lumps.
- 5. Mix in the chocolate mixture.
- 6. Refrigerate for about 1 and $\frac{1}{2}$ hour. The mixture should be firm.
- 7. With a spoon or 3 oz scoop, place mixture in 4 oz individual cake pans or cupcake tins.
- 8. Back at 350 degrees for 10-15 minutes.

Let sit for at least 3 minutes.

Serve while warm to the pleasure of your family and friends breaking through the cooked outer to find the center to be warm and gooey.
