The Lambert Airport privatization effort has officially ended.

Cara Spencer, Ward 20 Alderwoman, is running for Mayor.

Development at Jefferson and Arsenal- DeSales Community Development was unable to secure tax credits for proposed senior housing but plan to reapply. Interest has been expressed by other developers as well. All proposals require neighborhood approval.

Aldermanic Board Resolution 205 will direct the Board of E & A to not fund the workhouse, end federal contracts for housing federal inmates in order to provide sufficient space in the City Justice Center, and divert the \$16 million in savings to social services. Residents can reach out to Board President Reed and Mayor Krewson to express support for the resolution.

Board Bill 107 to expand 6 police precincts to 9 has been revised to 7 instead. The Police Chief and Director of Public Safety oppose the Bill. All police resources will be allocated based on calls for service. Please call all issues in; use the non-emergency line as appropriate.
